In 2008...

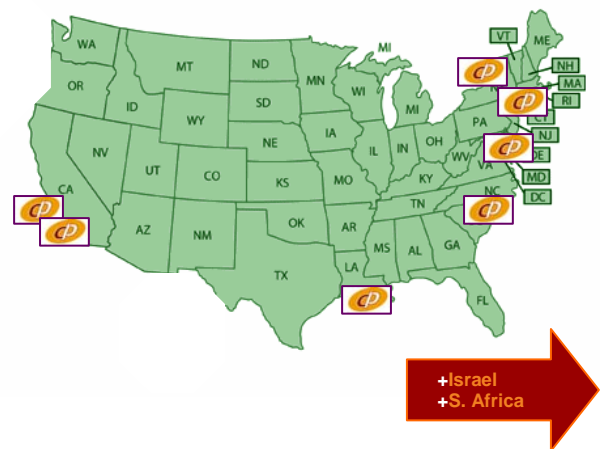
- 100% of City at Peace twelfth graders graduated from high school, compared to 70% nationally
- 95% of City at Peace twelfth graders went on to college in the fall, compared to 68% nationally
- 94% of participants identified themselves as leaders, a 450% increase over the year

“The things I learned through City at Peace are all about human experience. Seeing the injustice of the world and saying ‘that’s enough,’ and learning how to do that together and how to create change, within ourselves and in the world around us.

Now at the young age of 20, looking back at that 13-year-old little girl I once was, it baffles me that I have managed to evolve into the ‘woman’ I am.
